- In his Nicomachean Ethics, Aristotle claims that "every art and every inquiry, every action and choice, seems to aim at some good; whence the good has rightly been defined as that at which all things aim." According to this theological perspective of ethics, what is man's ultimate good?
- Man is essentially a rational animal, interacting with reality through his senses, and entering into communication through his linguistic abilities. Discuss.
- 3. Aristotle calls the first philosophers (the Presocratics) "physicists" or students of nature. In what ways were they also philosophers and how did they differ from the mythologists who preceded them?
- 4. Explain why Metaphysics was particularly important in Medieval thought.
- Discuss fully <u>any one</u> of the first three arguments for the existence of God given by Aquinas in the Summa Theologica.
- Explain how the mendicant orders and the universities affected philosophical activity in the Middle Ages.
