ANSWER ONE QUESTION

1. "As a science, psychology operates on the assumption that behavior, including religious behavior and the things we choose to do of our free will, is the result of the operation of natural cause-effect laws... To explain behavior means to describe it with its functional relationships to other behaviors and environmental circumstances, pulling it together with some organizing framework called a theory. This does not negate nor prove the religious or the supernatural" (R.Paloutzian, Chap.3.). Comment.
